

**TOWN OF HAYWARD
SAWYER COUNTY, WI
ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE ORDINANCE 2-05**

As amended through May 8, 2012

The Town Board of the Town of Hayward does ordain as follows:

1. That the following named roads in the Town of Hayward shall be designated as an all-terrain vehicle route between those areas posted as such with all-terrain vehicle route signs:
 - a. Conger Road (so ATV's can connect with the Tuscobia and other woodland trails)
 - b. Chippewa Trail (Sect. 25 of T41'N, R 9 W and Sect. 31 of T41 N, R8 W) from Bender Road to 31 Trail crossing with Chippewa Trail (FireTower Trail).
 - c. Trailhead on Chippewa Trail, East to County Road B (approx. 320 feet)
 - d. Indian Trail Road-approximately 50 feet between ATV trails
 - e. Green Lake Road-approximately 60 yards between ATV trails
 - f. Indian Lake Road - approximately a mile. Route would start a mile from Hwy E at ATV trail and use approx. 1 mile of road to the end and ATV trail.
 - g. Gurno Lake Road-approximately 4/10 mile from ATV trail to Larson Road
 - h. Larson Road-from Gurno Lake Road to Couderay town line
 - i. The Town's portion of County Hill Road to the Washburn County line. All adjacent Stonewood West roads are included.
 - j. Gorney Road from County Hill Road to the end or its entirety.
 - k. Gorud Road from County Hill Road to the end or in its entirety.
2. **Speed Limits**
 - a. The speed limit shall be 25 miles per hour while operating on the above named road(s). Note: State Law restricts all-terrain vehicle speed to 10 MPH within 150 feet of a dwelling between the hours of 10:30 PM and 7:00 AM.
 - b. Routes with a speed limit of 10 MPH-

3. All-terrain vehicles shall operate on the extreme right side of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic.
4. All-terrain vehicles are to be operated in single file.
5. All-terrain vehicle operators shall yield the right-of-way to all other vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
6. Headlights shall be turned on and in working order at all times while operating on the roadway or shoulder.
7. Operators of all-terrain vehicles violating any of the above conditions would be subject to the underlying violation of illegally operating on the roadway.
8. Operators of all-terrain vehicles travel at their own risk and the Town of Hayward will not be liable for any damages or injuries to operators of all-terrain vehicles occurring in the Town of Hayward.
9. The Town of Hayward Police Department, the Sawyer County Sheriff's Department and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources are the designated law enforcement agencies responsible for enforcing the provisions of this Ordinance.
10. The penalty for violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance is the same as listed in s. 23.33, Wis. Stats. as adopted by reference.
11. This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as provided by law and shall repeal and replace all previous all-terrain vehicle ordinances heretofore enacted by the Town of Hayward.
