Highway Excavation Ordinance

Section 6. (Cont). depressions or bumps. The Town Board or the Road Supervisor may require that boring be done instead of trenching. Upon completion of the boring, tunnel shall be backfilled with compacted sand. The Town Board or the Road Supervisor may require that a pipe be installed under the road to run utilities through to eliminate trenching or boring in the future.

Section 7. This ordinance shall also apply to trenches and pipe lying along the Town roads within Town road right-of-way and a permit is required. The maximum length of any open trench at any time shall be kept to the minimum as approved by the Road Supervisor.

Section 8. Supervision. From time to time the Road Supervisor, Town Chairperson or the Towns Engineer consultant may inspect the work being done in or under any Town road, or within the Town road right-of-way.

Section 9. Protective measures for the public and routing traffic. It shall be the duty of every person cutting or making an excavation in or upon any Town road or within the Town road right-of-way to place and maintain appropriate barriers and warning devices necessary for safety of the public.

Section 10. Care of excavated material. All material excavated from the trenches and piled adjacent to the trenches or in any road shall be piled and maintained in such a manner as not to endanger those working in the trench, pedestrians or users of the roads

Section 11. Cleanup. All work areas shall be kept clear of all rubbish, excess earth, and other debris resulting from such work. All clean up work shall be at the expense of the permittee. If the area is not cleaned up to the satisfaction of the Road Supervisor or the Town Board, the work may be done by the Town and charged to the permittee and deducted from any required bond or deposit.

Section 12. Protection of watercourses. The permittee shall maintain watercourses during the time of the work and shall be required to restore all watercourses and ditches to the condition as existed prior to the permittees' work, to allow the drainage of water, without causing washouts. This may include but not be limited to seeding, mulching or some form of rip rap. The permittee shall be responsible for any damage resulting from its failure to do so.

Section 13. Noise, dust and debris. Each permittee shall conduct and carry out work in such a manner as to avoid unnecessary inconvenience and annoyance to the general public and occupants of the neighboring properties. The permittee shall take reasonable measures to reduce to the fullest extent, during the performance of the work, noise, dust and debris.

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Section 14. Emergency action. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to prevent the completion of such work as may be necessary for the preservation of life or property, for the location of trouble in conduit or pipe or making emergency repairs, provided that person making the repairs shall apply to the Road Supervisor or Town Chairperson for such a permit on the first working day after such work is started.

Section 15. Location records. Any permittee doing work upon Town roads or rights-or-way shall provide to the Town of Hayward and maintain in its files an accurate record of all its underground facilities, except the minor facilities that connect a particular facility to a particular premise or building.

Section 16. Penalty. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) but not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) plus court costs for each offense. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 17. Enforcement. The Town Chairperson, Road Supervisor or the Constable may institute appropriate action to enjoin violations of this ordinance in addition to any other penalties stated herein, which may include but not limited to application for a Writ of Prohibition or mandamus.

This ordinance was adopted at the regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Hayward on October 1, 1996 and shall be deemed to be in force from this day forward, according to law.

This ordinance was adopted on October 1, 1996 and amended on February 13, 1997. The original Ordinance and Amendment are on file at Town of Hayward.

OFFICIAL TRAFFIC MAP AND CONTROL DEVICES
ORDINANCE 98-01

SECTION 1: Duty of the Town of Hayward Hwy Dept. to erect and install uniform traffic control devices.

Whenever traffic regulations created by this Ordinance including a State of Wisconsin traffic regulation adopted by reference in Section 1, require the erection of traffic control devices for the enforcement, the Town of Hayward Hwy Dept. shall procure, erect, and maintain uniform traffic control devices conforming to the Uniform Traffic Control Manual promulgated by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, giving notice of such traffic regulation to the users of the highways on which such regulations apply. Whenever State law grants discretion to local authorities in erecting or placement of a uniform traffic control device, devices shall be erected in such locations and in such a manner as in the judgment if the Town of Hayward will carry out the purpose of this Ordinance and give adequate warning to users of the highways of the Town of Hayward.

SECTION 2: Official Traffic Map.

[a] The Town of Hayward shall establish an Official Traffic Map which shall indicate no parking and restricted parking areas, stop signs, yield signs, special speed limits, one way highways, school crossing, and all restrictions or limitations contained in this Ordinance, as from time to time amended or modified by the Town of Hayward when the laws of the State of Wisconsin require the erection or use of official traffic control devices to enforce such restrictions or limitations.

[b] Violations Prohibited. When official traffic control devices giving notice of the restrictions, prohibitions, and limitations shown on the official traffic map are erected and maintained in accordance with this Ordinance and Chapter 346 of Wisconsin State Statutes., a violation of the restriction, prohibition or limitation shown on the Official Traffic Map shall be a violation of the provision of this Ordinance.

[c] The Official Traffic Map shall be maintained and displayed in the office of the Town of Hayward Clerk and Circuit Court.

[d] The Town of Hayward Board may from time to time make additions to or deletions from the Official Traffic Map and the Town of Hayward Chairperson or Road Supervisor shall keep the Official Traffic Map current.

SECTION 3: Prohibited Signs and Markers in Highways.

No person, other than an officer authorized by this Ordinance to erect traffic control devices or his or her designee, shall place within the limits of any highway maintained by the Town to Hayward any sign, signal, marker, mark or monument unless permission is first obtained from the Town of Hayward. Any sign, signal, marker, or monument placed or maintained in violation of this section shall be subject to removal as provided in section 4.

SECTION 4: Removal of unofficial sign, signal, marker, or monument.

The Town of Hayward Chairperson or Road Supervisor may remove any sign, signal, marker, or monument place in violation of this Ordinance or State Laws.
