TOWN OF HAYWARD SAWYER COUNTY, WISCONSIN

Off Premise Sale of Intoxicating Liquors by Class B Retailers ORDINANCE NO. 18

An Ordinance of the Town of Hayward, Sawyer County, WI regulating the off premise sale of intoxicating liquors by Class B retailers.

Whereas the Town of Hayward may grant and issue licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages subject to limitations and restrictions imposed by law.

Now, therefore, the Town Board of the Town of Hayward does ordain to grant the privilege of selling intoxicating liquors in original packages or containers in accordance with WI Stat. 125.51{3}{b} to Class B retailers

SECTION ONE

- A. The Town of Hayward may grant and issue a Class B license for the retail sales of intoxicating liquor from Premises within the municipality to persons entitled to a license under Wisconsin statutes as the town board deems proper.
- B. Holders of a Class B intoxicating liquor license must also hold a Class B fermented malt beveragelicense.

SECTION TWO

- A. A Class B license authorizes the retail sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises where sold by the glass. Wine may be sold in the original package or container in any quantity to be consumed off the premises where sold.
- B. In accordance with WI Stat. 125,51 {3}{b} the Town of Hayward authorizes the sale of intoxicating liquor in the original package or container, in multiples not to exceed 4 liters at any one time, and to be consumed off the premises where sold.

SECTIONTHREE

A. The sale of intoxicating liquor in the original package or container for consumption off the premises may not take place between 12 midnight and 8 a.m.

SECTION FOUR

This ordinance shall become effective and in force upon passage and publication thereof.
